



Food & Beverage Stallholder Information

Background

The Nayri Niara *good spirit* Festival is a three-day gathering of music, ceremony, knowledge sharing and arts, held in a stunning cultural landscape that is lunawunna alonnah, Bruny Island, Tasmania.

The Festival is a powerful opportunity for Indigenous and non-indigenous people to share knowledge and ceremony, honouring ancient traditions and contemporary innovation.

The Nayri Niara good spirit Festival hosts an amazing array of musicians, dancers, healers and teachers from across the globe to explore and connect Indigenous, earth-based wisdoms and emergent sustainable practices. Strengthening personal relationships and encouraging cohesion between diverse communities through the expression of arts is the heartbeat of this Festival.

Location and Access

Food and Drink Stalls will be located within the festival precinct onsite on private property at Cloudy Bay, Bruny Island. A large shaded area will be in the area for patrons to sit and eat together. Site allocations are ground space only. Marquees, tables, chairs, signage, etc are the responsibility of the stallholder. Stallholders are responsible for keeping their own site and the surrounding area clean throughout the day. Spaces are limited and will be filled as completed registrations and deposit payment are received.

Capacity

Maximum Capacity for the Festival is 999, which includes patrons, artists, crew and volunteers. We have had 500-700 attendees at our previous 2 festivals.

Trading Hours

The Festival opens to patrons at 12 noon Friday 8th March for camping only. Festival program starts 10 am Saturday 9th March and all stallholders will need to be on site and set up by this time.

Sustainability Expectations & Waste Policy

We are working towards a zero waste event – While we are not quite there yet, there are several important waste considerations that we expect to be upheld by stallholders. No bottled drinks are to be sold (there is tap

water available) and **all disposable products must be compostable**. If you do not know where to find compostable products, we can give you supplier contact information. Compostable products include crockery and cutlery.

Any materials used in food and beverage services must be separated and disposed of appropriately (either recycled or composted). All containers are to be rinsed prior to disposal. No plastic bags are allowed.



NNF aims to lead by example featuring the best of Tasmanian, sustainably produced food and beverage. We ask all food and beverage stalls to put an emphasis on food which is sourced locally and is made with organic or fair-trade ingredients where possible. We would like to offer food options that feature vegetarian ingredients with any animal products being local, free range and sustainably managed. Please consider listing all of the ingredients used in your products and where they were grown.

Power

There is limited power available onsite. Please minimise the power and water that you use and ensure that you notify us of your power requirements at the time of booking. Generators will be available for Food and Beverage stalls to connect to. Stallholders requiring power will be accommodated on a first in, best dressed basis. All appliances and power leads will need to be tagged and tested before using onsite.

Site Dimensions:

NNF is happy to be flexible around site dimensions as we acknowledge many stallholders will be bringing food vans. Please discuss your requirements with us so that we are able to site you in the best position for your stall.

Water:

Stallholders have access to water for washing and drinking. The closest tap might be a few hundred metres away, so please bring large containers to move water, if required by your stall. Waste water will be collected by the festival.

Waste

We will have recycling and rubbish (landfill) bins available for stallholder use. Please minimise waste wherever possible and separate your recyclables from landfill items conscientiously.

Insurance

All stallholders are required to carry their own public and product liability insurance. Public liability is provided by Nayri Niara for the public and public areas and our product liability insurance will cover you should any of your product be damaged by the festival (ie power cutting out and ruining contents of your fridge). This does not cover stallholders for damage resulting from their own actions and as such stallholders are required to provide this for themselves.

Kingborough City Council Regulations and Food Hygiene

All food and beverage stalls are required to comply with all relevant Environmental Health, Fire and Workplace Safety Standards and are expected to familiarise themselves with these prior to the event. Each stall will need to provide hand washing facilities at their stall for use by staff handling food. Each stall will also require a fire extinguisher at their stall.

Stallholders must obtain a Temporary Food Stall Permit from Kingborough Council (which must be displayed for the duration of the festival) and ensure that all food is prepared, packed, displayed and sold in accordance with KCC's Public Health Requirements for Temporary Stallholders. Bump In

Food and Drink Stallholders can bump in on Thursday, 7th March between 8am and 6pm or between 8am and 12noon on Friday 8 March. All stalls must be set up and vehicles must be in out of festival area and in parking area before festival gates open and patrons arrive.

Bump Out

Bump out times for all stallholders will be on Monday and Sunday once all patrons are offsite. Everything must be removed from the site by Monday evening.

Cost

The cost for having a food & beverage stall at Nayri Niara is \$350. Two complimentary festival tickets (including camping) will be issued for each stall. If you require additional tickets for stallholders, these will need to be purchased via our [online box office](#).

We ask for a 50% deposit to secure your position as soon as your application has been accepted. Deposit to be paid into the following account and please be sure to include the personalised reference:
